## ... but without animal suffering!

Please consider:

The so-called “modern rearing methods“ in animal husbandry are only useful for farmers because they help to save expensive work time. These methods suppress most of the natural needs of the animals (need to move around, have individual space, their play instinct).

Through sheer boredom animals, which are too tightly packed together, bite and peck each other. In turn this leads to heavy injuries including cannibalism. Animal keepers prevent this by amputations such as:

- shortening the beaks of turkeys, Moschus ducks and many laying hens
- cutting off the tails of pigs
- sawing off the horns of cattle

Such mutilation is not allowed in ecological animal husbandry.

Enjoy the products of fair animal husbandry (e.g. “Neuland”) or of ecologically sound rearing!
